


Three Video Presentations on the Shroud of Turin in Parish Hall



The Shroud of Turin is believed by many to be Christ's burial Shroud. The cloth has a faint image of a crucified man on it and it exhibits many truly amazing properties. 1. The negative of the Shroud image has more detail of the body shown on the cloth than the Shroud itself. 2. The 3D properties of the Shroud are shown in the green image to the left. 3. The Shroud image shows the nail holes anatomically correctly going through the wrists. These are but three of the amazing Shroud properties that can teach us about Christ's passion and Resurrection that will be discussed in 3 sessions on the Shroud.

In early August a 4-day conference on the Shroud of Turin was held in St. Louis and was attended by experts from 10 different countries. There were 85 talks by these Shroud experts that were recorded, edited, and placed on YouTube. The topics covered spanned theology, history, medicine, and new technologies like AI. On Feb. 25, March 4 and 18 at 6:30PM in the parish hall under the church videos of 3 of the Shroud talks will be played, followed by a question-and-answer period. Each talk is about 50 minutes. The schedule for the videos is as follows:

1. "The Shroud Puzzle Solved" by William West - Date: Feb. 25 at 6:30PM

West has written 3 books on the Shroud and in his talk, he gives a detailed overview of the Shroud's properties and exceptionally strong arguments for its authenticity as Christ's burial Shroud. This talk summarizes in an excellent way all the evidence in support of the Shroud's authenticity.

2. "3D & AI Reveal the Shroud of Turin" by Otangelo Grasso - Date: March 4 at 6:30PM

Grasso is a prolific publisher on Shroud topics and an expert on AI applied to photography. In this talk he uses his skills to bring the Shroud image as well as gospel scenes to life. He is able to recreate an anatomically correct image from the Shroud of what Christ must have looked like.

3. "Contemplating the Shroud: A Journey Through History, Faith, and the Resurrection" by Emanuela Marinelli (narrator) and Domenico Repice - Date: March 18 at 6:30PM (Note – 2 weeks after previous talk)

Emanuela Marinelli has degrees in Natural and Geological Sciences. She is a visiting professor at the Pontifical Athenaeum Regina Apostolorum in Rome, and has given lectures and written articles on the Shroud. In the talk she discusses the history of the Shroud's journey from Jerusalem to France.
